

Method

Enlist subjects

- Campaigns ran on Facebook
- Subjects paid \$50 gift voucher for their time

Research interviews

- 24 people who were either participants of the NDIS or nominees
 - Interviews were semi structured

key questions

- What relationship is the nominee to the participant?
- How long have you had/acted as a nominee?
- What type of decisions do you get help / help with?
 - Why do you have/act as a nominee?
 - What is your decision making process?
- If you could support the person to make more of their own decisions, would you be interested?

Results

- Code the transcripts looking for patterns
- Complete thematic analysis
